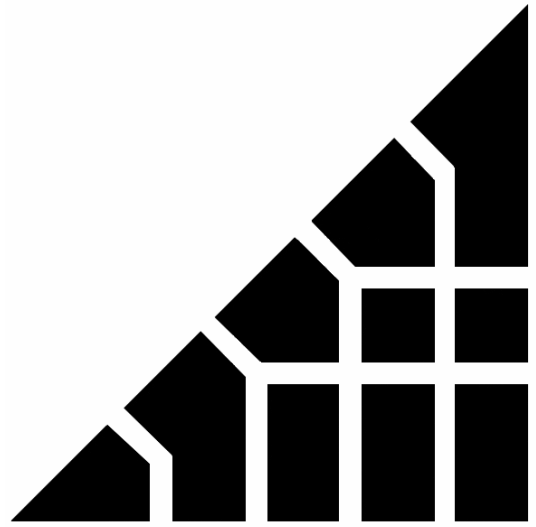

Environmental Day @ Ted Reeve Arena Saturday May 29th

Need to replace a battered blue box? Need to dispose of leftover paint? Looking to buy a rain barrel? Then plan to be at Ted Reeve Area (175 Main Street at Gerrard) on Saturday May 29th between 10am-2pm for Ward 32's Environmental Day.

Here are some of the things that you can drop off or pick up during the event:

Items for purchase:

- Apartment recyclebox - \$4
- Blue/grey box - \$6
- Yard waste bin - \$7
- Indoor/outdoor water efficiency kit - \$15
- Backyard composter - \$15
- Small rain barrel - \$60

Pick up for FREE:

- Blue/grey box - with proof of new residency in the last 90 days or in exchange for a damaged box
- Leaf compost - bring your containers and shovel

Items to donate for re-use:

- Books (no magazines; please recycle them in your grey box)
- Non-perishable food items
- Eyeglasses, walkers, wheelchairs, hearing

aids and other medical equipment

- Leftover paint
- Small household appliances in working condition
- Clothing and linens in good condition
- Bicycles and other sporting goods

Also for re-use, but please keep separate from above items:

- Children's books and National Geographic Magazines
- Cassette tapes, CDs, VHS tapes and their cases
- Hockey helmets and jerseys
- Materials for arts programs such as broken watches, buttons, corks and corkboards, costume jewellery, crayons, dress-up clothing (old prom dresses and such), bulk

and remnant fabric, keys, markers, pencils and other arts and crafts materials

Drop off for recycling and/or safe disposal:

- Cellular phones, telephones, fax machines, photocopiers and radios
- Computers and other electronics (no TVs or microwaves unless they work)
- Household hazardous waste such as batteries, medicine, mercury thermometers, motor oil, propane tanks and solvents
- Tires (off the rim, maximum of five)
- Polystyrene
- Plastic grocery bags
- Plastic tubs and lids
- NO OTHER PLASTICS PLEASE
